Grant of Probate - Schedule of Assets

A **Schedule of Assets** is a detailed list of all the assets owned by the deceased at the time of their death. This document is a crucial component of the **Grant of Probate** application process, as it provides a comprehensive overview of the estate's assets.

The Schedule of Assets typically includes various types of assets, such as:

- Real estate properties (e.g., HDB flats, private property, landed property)
- Bank accounts
- Investments (stocks, bonds, mutual funds)
- Insurance policies
- Personal property (e.g., vehicles)
- Business interests

It does not include CPF monies and liabilities e.g., outstanding mortgages and credit card debts. It also does not include joint bank accounts as monies in joint bank accounts legally belong to the surviving joint account holder.

The accuracy and completeness of the **Schedule of Assets** are essential for the application process to ensure that all relevant information is accounted for and that the distribution of the deceased's estate is carried out correctly.

In the application, the **Schedule of Assets** is submitted to the court along with other required documents to obtain the **Grant of Probate**, which authorizes the executor to administer the estate according to the terms of the will.
